- Downtown Grill and Brewery (Local brewery with lots of bar-type American food)
- Nama (The best sushi in Knoxville)

### In Market Square

- Stock and Barrel (The best burger you'll eat. The "Hurt Locker" helps cure hangovers)
- Café 4 (Lighter fare, amazing desserts)
- Tomato Head (Pizza and homemade desserts)

### The Old City

- Stir (Craft cocktails and higher-end dining)
- Kaizen (Asian flare including Bao Buns)
- Southern Grit (Southern higher-end dining)

- Maple Hall Bowling Alley (Bowling and cocktails)
